They have agreed to permit the "Doorknob Collector" to continue as the official voice of A.D.S.A. They have chosen, because of personal pressures, not to continue as editors and publishers. Thanks Faye and Rich, for all you have done.

The good news, announced by Arnie Fredrick, Vice President of A.D.C.A., is that Lee and Jim Kaiser of Minneapolis have agreed to become the new editors of our newsletter, with A.D.C.A. as the publisher.

We hope more of you will want to support A.D.C.A. with your membership. We will be working hard to give you your money's worth by providing an organization thru which your interest and knowledge will grow.

Catalog Lending: Old hardware catalogs are hard to find and usually quite expensive. We have found that a catalog or selective parts of a catalog can be copied quite successfully on an ordinary office copier if it has been properly serviced.

Charles Wardell of Trinity, No. Carolina recently allowed us to copy his "Locks and Builders Hardware" by Henry Towne, and a couple of Corbin catalogs.

Mr. Wardell has told us he would let other collectors copy his catalogs if they pay the shipping costs both ways.

We have a Reading Catalog #19, circa 1911, which we would lend out for copying. It's a heavy catalog and costs about \$7 to ship parcel post.

Perhaps other collectors have catalogs they would be willing to loan, and there are undoubtedly many collectors who would like to get copies of specific catalogs. We for example, would like to get copies of Branford and Russell & Erwin catalogs.

Our attorney says there should be no legal problem in copying a catalog because the copy rights have long since expired and the catalogs are not being reproduced for re-sale.
